University of St Andrews - Nursery Allocation procedure

The University of St Andrews nursery aims to provide childcare places to all staff and students following a fair process but will prioritise places to Parents who fall into the following criteria. Thereafter, all other applicants (including external applicants) will be offered places (when available) according to the date when they applied.

The priority groups are:

- 1. Parents or children with a disability
- 2. Lone parents (this only applies where one parent has sole legal responsibility for the child. It does not apply where parents live and/or work apart)
- 3. Student parents.

Exceptions

In the case of a genuine emergency requirement for childcare, an exception to the allocation procedure may be made. If this is the case, you should email the Director of Residential & Business Services.

The University of St Andrews nursery will never operate at full capacity, to allow for these emergency situations.
